

Huge thanks to all our existing leaders for their continued enthusiasm. Special mention goes out to Nicola Walters for giving up so much of her time, leading Monday Beavers, Houndkirk Cubs and sitting on our Executive Committee - we are so grateful for her support. Thanks also to our membership secretary, Andy Bush, who somehow manages to organise moves through the sections and keep our waiting list under control!





Farewell to Geoffrey and Maureen Cope



As planning started for the Gala and Festival this year it was with great sadness that two of our long-standing members would be missing; Geoffrey and Maureen Cope. Maureen died suddenly in July 2022 and Geoff in March 2023. They had been involved in our Scout Group for 34 years.

Geoff joined our Scout Group in September 1989 as a Section Leader. Over time he became the Group Scout Leader, a member of

the Group Executive Committee and then Chairman. During this time, he also joined the Scout Gala Committee, then became Chairman.

In 2005, he led our 'Buy a Brick' community request in 2005, which brought in £14,000. This funded a huge part of the refurbishment needed to the Scout Hut. His technical skills helped create the Dore Scouts website, which proved to be a very useful organisational tool for all members and those wishing to join us.

In 2010 Geoff was given The Award and Bar of Merit by the Chief Scout in recognition of his conscientious, imaginative and dedicated service to Scouting over many years.

At the Gala in 2012 Geoff was awarded the Crowson Bowl by the Scout Group Executive and Gala Committee for contributing more than 25 years to the Gala. He made a tremendous contribution with unfailing enthusiasm, such as designing and editing the Gala magazine and putting forward a constant stream of other new initiatives. Even after he stood down as Gala Committee Chair, he continued to serve as a member for many years.

26 years ago, Maureen joined Syd Crowson and Anne Elsdon in co-ordinating Dore Festival fortnight. When Syd died, Maureen continued this work with Anne. On Anne's retirement in 2019, Maureen continued right up to the time of her death. For many years at the Gala she could be found serving tea at the tea tent and more recently heading the group of ladies on the plant stall.

Maureen supported Geoff wholeheartedly in his Scouting activities. If he was missing during the day or at a mealtime, he would often be at the Scout Hut working on a maintenance project with David Needham (Ned) alongside, preparing for a Scout Community Event, or at a Scout meeting.

We will miss Geoff and Maureen greatly, especially on Gala Day, but we are hoping to make this year as big a success as possible in tribute to them both.



Dore Scouts Charity Trail Run 2023



This year during festival season we're planning two sponsored trail runs to raise funds for the Dore Scouts. They're open to anyone aged 18 or over (plus Explorer Scouts) who would like to come along.

The goal is for participants and the Scout group to raise funds via our Gofundme page for the event. There are two events so that as many people as possible can join us and take on the challenge.

The runs will be in groups with a leader - so no danger of getting lost! And both events are group runs - not races - so we'll go at the speed of the group which is likely to include a mixture of jogging and walking.

Option 1: Run the Totley Tunnel – Saturday 1st July '23

This route is approximately 10km with 243m overall climb (or 6 miles with 800 feet climb). We will follow a linear route from Grindleford station, over the moors back to Dore & Totley Station, roughly following the route of the tunnel. We'll meet at Dore & Totley Train Station at 10am on Saturday 1st July for the 10:21 train to Grindleford.

Option 2: Run The Great Ridge - Sunday 2nd July '23

This route is the big one! We'll be taking in approximately 37km with 1.3 km overall climb (or 23 miles with 4250 feet climb)

The Great Ridge is one of the scenic areas in the Peak District. From Edale we'll run up to Mam Tor and follow the Great Ridge along until it descends into Hope. We'll then take the steep back route up to the Winn Hill summit. The route then takes us along the

Derwent via Shatton and Leadmill Bridge before climbing through Grindleford to White Edge. We then descend down the Sheaf Valley to Dore & Totley Train Station. Meet at Dore & Totley Train Station at 10am on Sunday 2nd July for the 9:21 train.




